December Ponderings

Dear Friends,

I was speechless. Children's time is always an interesting conversation, with the pastor, as usual trying to move from the everyday to something about God, Jesus, or Spirit. We were discussing signs of Christmas on the first Sunday, and when wreathes were mentioned, I was ready to talk about things like circles with "no end," or the "ever" green aspect in wintertime, but one child says: "Oh, the circle has no sides to it, and also Jesus didn't take sides!" Speechless, because I never heard that one before, and speechless because it has both a simple truth, yet also a complexity that would need much more than a two minute children's time to discuss! Jesus not taking sides would be profoundly true in the sense that Jesus was the Prince of Peace, the consummate Peacemaker, always working to unite and reunite people. Yet he was not hesitant to call sin sin and call evil evil, so we could also say that he was on the side of goodness, on the side of truth, on the side of love, etc. With regards to all the bickering and finger pointing that we humans do, I suppose he really would not take sides, since he advised "taking the log out of one's own eye, before going after the speck in the other's eye."

So I will remember this insight this Christmas season when I see a wreath..... now I will begin to see a "wreath of peace." No sharp corners, no straight sides, but that continuum and connectedness of humanity that is also a circle. Unfortunately this 2015 season is full of animosity, hatred, and war on so many levels, from our election year political battles and name calling, to the protracted war in the Middle East. Jesus' teachings instruct us so well on the personal level and hopefully our candidates can debate issues without personal assaults. With "logs and specks" in all our eyes, forgiveness of sin is always needed, for self and for neighbors. But at tribal and national levels, it is so much more difficult. Forgiving murder and terrorist slaughter just doesn't seem effective in stopping it. Some degree of force seems necessary at times, with "surgical precision" if possible, to stop or remove those promising to continue with mass murder.

Anyway, the pink candle of the Advent wreath is about Joy, and it reminds us that we can always rejoice and be thankful for something, no matter how bad things might seem. Gratitude and Thanksgiving with songs of Praise are always appropriate to lift spirits, to heal, to reconcile, as we celebrate that Peace and Love were incarnate in Jesus of Nazareth and are still present for us today as we make room for his Spirit in our lives. Hope to see you soon, and for an evening of light-hearted fun, let me recommend the very affordable acoustic and bluegrass Christmas Concert, Saturday eve, December 19, in our own stage room. I've seen two of their concerts, and the group on stage seems like a big family having some fun with Christmas songs!

THE PETTENGILL HOUSE, INC. Children & Family Services

December's Extra Mile Offering is The Pettengill House, Inc. Children & Family services. The Pettengill House, Inc. was founded in 1994 by a diverse group of local residents and agency representatives to specifically address the needs of the most at-risk, underserved children and families. The original goals were primarily prevention related. However, it immediately became clear that the organization's clientele were primarily concerned with survival issues of food, clothing, shelter, health and safety.

Last year our community programs served 3,100 clients, distributed 425+ backpacks/school supplies and 395 winter coats, supported 333 students through our School Link Service Program, provided 117,000+ meals, helped enroll 30+ clients in Mass Health, given 48 clients access to food stamps, and aided in providing \$82,000+ in Emergency Assistance Funds (housing, utilities, medical, transportation, education, and after school programs). That's what we call community teamwork, and we want to do more. Pettengill's service area is Amesbury, Byfield, Groveland, Merrimac, Newbury, Newburyport, Rowley, Salisbury, and West Newbury, Massachusetts




