I make an act of joy toward all sad hearts,  
Where laughter pales and tears abound.  
I make a deed to God of all my days - -  
And look out on life with quiet eyes.*

I'm fascinated that he closed his thoughts on Christmas with “quiet eyes.” Something of the stillness of Christmastime is advocated. It speaks to me of receptivity, yes, the waiting time, yes, the acknowledgment that we must receive much of this as sheer gift. Then we also must act, and put plenty of energy into good works. Then we watch, with quiet eyes, for the fulfillment that only God can bring. The theological emphases of grace and good deeds are nicely balanced!

So let us all put energy into “Keeping Christmas,” so that love and peace may increase everywhere. And let us acknowledge that we begin by humbly, quietly receiving love through Christ, our “Love Divine.”

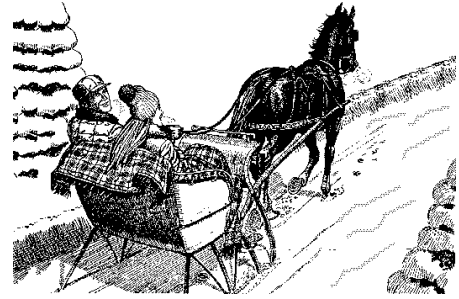

# 2011 Year End Contribution Statements

Tax deductible contributions will be reported on an Annual Contribution Statement sent out as early in January 2012 as possible. For the IRS, the date of the check and the date that the church receives the contribution determines the IRS deduction year. In the case of a mailed check, the postmark determines the date of receipt. For instance:

- Checks dated in December 2011 and received in 2011 deductible in 2011;
- Checks dated in December 2011 and received in offering in January 2012 deductible in 2012;
- Checks dated in January 2012 and received in offering in December 2011 deductible in 2012;
- Checks dated in December 2011, postmarked in 2011, and received by church in January 2012 deductible in 2011;
- Checks dated in December 2011, postmarked in 2012, and received by church in January 2012 deductible in 2012.

The monthly Extra Mile Collections are NOT reported on the Belleville Annual Statements. Your checks should be used to substantiate a deduction to these charities.

## Notice of By-Laws Amendment

The Church's By-Laws have been amended in response to questions arising during the year regarding incorporation, acting on behalf of the church, signing contracts, etc. There will be a vote during the February Annual Meeting to accept these amendments, which will require a two thirds vote of Active Members. The amended By-Laws are available for review now, outside the Administrator's (Heather's) office.

Changes of significance are in the areas of membership, voting rights of active members vs. inactive members, voting by proxy allowed, and an indemnification clause that addresses the membership's concern when acting on behalf of the church.

## Building and Grant Update

The year 2011 was a great year for Belleville. For those of you who have not noticed the restored porches on the Fiske Parish Hall, you are invited to do so.

The Capital Campaign funded the Connector between the Meeting House and the Fiske Chapel providing a pleasing and much needed handicap access to both buildings. The handicap toilet facilities, the new office, new kitchen location, and other improvements funded by the Capital Campaign have provided support to the many activities that have taken place during the past year. The Capital Campaign is still ongoing and some pledges are still forthcoming.

There were many initiatives originated and completed during 2011. The floors of the Stage Bannister and Parlor rooms were restored and finished using \$10,000 grants provided by the Institution for Savings and the Newburyport Five Cents Savings Bank. Three porches attached to the Fiske Chapel were restored using \$40,000 provided by the Newburyport CPA Funds. Thank you to Jim Marshall and Bob Locke who coordinated and supervised these projects.
